From the Pastor's Desk



Brothers and sisters of St. Matthew UMC-

I feel that it's best that you hear this from your pastor before you hear it from any other source. The United Methodist Church has made a major decision, eliminating language from our Book of Discipline that bans gay weddings and gay clergy. Part of the follow up legislation also protects conservative clergy and congregations from being forced to perform such ceremonies if it violates their understanding of Scripture or

their convictions.

I get that this is a seismic shift for many of us. But St. Matthew is the same community that it has always been. I know that on any given Sunday you sit in a pew next to someone that may disagree with you on this issue. But you've come to love that person and respect that person and even do ministry with that person. Heck, tomorrow morning this church will distribute 20,000 lbs. of food to folks that desperately need it, and some of our church members doing the work will be conservative and some will be progressive. And yet both will be doing the work of building the Kingdom of God.

When I stood before the Church Council last year and discussed possible changes on the horizon, I'll admit that I did not see things moving so quickly on the issue of human sexuality. But this new legislation does not force you to do anything that goes against your convictions. It just gives others in our denomination the right to practice theirs. Also, just because we've eliminated this language doesn't mean core parts of our Discipline are in danger. Our United Methodist Articles of Religion and Confession of Faith, which outline our main beliefs, are nearly impossible to amend. I remain very firm in my conviction that Jesus' divinity, our doctrine of salvation, and other core doctrines are not up for debate and won't be any time soon.

I know this decision is going to stir up some strong feelings among us. Honestly, it stirs up strong feelings in me, too. How are we supposed to survive as a church when this issue seems so divisive? How we answer this question will say a lot about who we are as individuals and as God's people. That's why I think we need to lean into what really matters.

Jesus said in John 13:34-35: "A new command I give you: Love one another. As I have loved you, so you must love one another. By this everyone will know that you are my disciples, if you love one another."

Our faith has never been about checking boxes or drawing lines. It's about radical, sacrificial love. Love that God has for us, and that we're called to have for God and each other. Look around this congregation — we're a mixed bag of political and social beliefs, backgrounds, and experiences. And that's beautiful! It's a reflection of God's boundless love and grace that we can all be part of the same community, that we can all put our trust in the same Savior.

We don't all see eye to eye on this issue. But we don't have to let it tear us apart. Instead, let's come together, united in our mission to love God and love others fiercely. Let's be known not for our opinions, but for our love – a love that knows no bounds.

In the meantime, let's pray together, seek God's wisdom, and continue to be a beacon of the love and hope that we have through Jesus.

John Wesley, once said: "Though we cannot think alike, may we not love alike? May we not be of one heart, though we are not of one opinion? Without all doubt, we may."

We may.

And I hope that we will.



All paperwork should be <u>COMPLETED</u>. If it is not, Kalyn will be getting with you to get it done! If you have questions, let Kalyn know!




