From the Pastor's Desk



St. Matthew Family-

My hope is that this newsletter finds you experiencing abundant blessings as we prepare to dive into a brand new year together. This last year was a wild ride, and I can't help but grin thinking about all the ways our community poured out love and kindness and drew people to Jesus. Seriously, you're all rock stars!

And let's talk about the season of Advent and our Christmas Eve services! It was an amazing experience worshipping together during that special time of year. The joy, the connection, the spirit of it all – it was next level. I'm still buzzing from it!

So, here we are, at the dawn of a fresh year. My hope is that we're all ready for more adventures, more laughter, and more of that goodness this community is all about. Most importantly, I hope we're ready to share Jesus with the world around us in even bolder ways.

We've got a lot of things planned to help make that happen, some of which begin this month. The first that I'd like to highlight is an all church study beginning at the end of January called "The Gift of Empathy." This study asks us to "imagine a world where everyone's go-to way of relating is empathy." That's the world The Gift of Empathy study aims to make a reality, equipping us to "relate in empathetic ways that make a difference in people's lives."

I think as church folks, we're often good at sympathy- that is, feeling concern for someone without becoming personally involved. But we sometimes struggle with empathy- that is, looking at the world from someone else's perspective to experience what they're feeling, and then expressing our understanding in ways that brings real help and healing.

If there's anything this world needs more of, it's empathy. The same kind of empathy Jesus showed us by becoming a mortal person and walking in our shoes, experiencing our human trials and tribulations, and overcoming them on our behalf.

Another thing I'd like to highlight is our new class on personal finance for young adults, which will be meeting on Wednesday nights at 6:30 starting January 10th. On the surface, this may not seem like much of a spiritual class. But if there's anything that young folks need it's the tools to manage their personal finances. So this is a great class to invite people to that AREN'T part of the church, giving them an easy entry point.

Finally, I'd like to take a moment of personal privilege to invite you to our next Worship Project, which takes place on January 25th. This modern liturgical worship service continues to build momentum, and we've got some big plans for it going forward. Anyways, there's a ton going on St. Matthew and I'm excited for all of it! I hope you're excited too.

It was such a fulfilling practice to focus on my goal setting, pray over the upcoming year, and dream about what this new year has for me. SO I WANT TO SHARE THIS PRACTICE WITH YOU. Like most of the things I share with you, there are better ways to set goals; I'm just introducing you to the idea; feel free to adapt this and make it your own.

This activity could also be done with children or grandchildren: if you do that I want to see pictures!

Supplies

1 to 3 8x10 Canvases

Glue or Tape - Modpodge if you want to get really fancy

Scissors

Paint

Crayons/Markers/Colored Pencils

A Printer

It's going to feel like making a collage in elementary art class! But don't worry, it's supposed to feel that way.

The first thing you want to do is pick a category; it can be anything you want to focus on improving this year

- 1. Spirituality
- 2. Health
- 3. Finances
- 4. Family
- 5. Travel

Anything can be a category, and remember, these are just for you, so don't worry about what anyone else will think.

Next, you will go on Pinterest or Google and start typing in keywords associated with the category. I'll use travel as an example.

Travel → Airplane

You'll print the photo out and attach it to the vision board for that category.

If you have magazines or newspapers hanging around, you can also use those!

You'll keep doing this until your boards are full to your liking! I enjoy arts and crafts, so in addition to putting pictures on my boards, I also painted them and glued on other bits and bobs I had lying around the house, like ribbons, buttons, and Polaroids.

The goal is for you to look at these boards every day, so be intentional with everything you put on them.

This next step is optional, but after you finish your boards, you can write a prayer that relates to it. This is something you'll pray for every day! (if you want help with this, come and see me!)

Finally, put the boards somewhere that you'll remember to look at them every day. Mine are in my study!

I updated my morning routine to include time to look at my vision boards and say the prayers I wrote for them; every morning, as I'm waiting for the kettle to boil, I spend time in intentional prayer over my goals!

I hope that your 2024 is a year full of intentional prayer and achieving your goals!
