### From the Pastor's Desk



As we enter into the season of Lent, I am excited to reflect on the rich heritage and history behind this holy time of prayer, penance, self-denial, and fasting that leads up to the celebration of Easter.

Lent has its origins in early Christian tradition. Historians generally agree that this 40-day period of period of intentional spiritual discipline emerged shortly following the Council of Nicea in 325 AD. The earliest observances of Lent seem to have focused particularly on the practice of fasting, which makes sense: the Scriptural inspiration for Lent is found in the 40 days Jesus spent fasting in the wilderness in Matthew 4, preparing to begin his ministry. For this reason, with each passing year, Christians around the world use this time to focus on the hope and grace found in Jesus's life and teachings.

Lent is a reminder that Jesus calls us to join Him in the wilderness so we can "climb the mountain of holiness and meet God there." For some of us, this means adopting a new spiritual discipline, while for others it might mean finding new ways to deny ourselves. While Lent can be seen as a time of somberness, we have the promise of joy to look forward to. For those of us who follow Jesus, the practice of Lent is a time to reflect and prepare for Easter. It's a way for believers to intentionally draw close to God, develop faith, and joyously await the fulfillment of the promise of Jesus' resurrection.

Following spiritual disciplines during Lent offers each of us a tangible platform for taking our own personal faith walks to the next level. We don't have to be perfect, and we don't always need to make all-encompassing, life-altering decisions to get where God is calling us. Sometimes all it takes is a steady and consistent commitment to connecting with God and growing in faith on a daily basis. We can challenge ourselves to be more tuned in to the Bible, engage in more prayer or study, or even set aside a few extra minutes each day to simply sit quietly and practice stillness.

What Jesus did in the wilderness wasn't easy. We remind ourselves of our own weakness and brokenness during this season because, unlike Jesus, we almost definitely WOULD have fallen to the enemy's temptations in the desert. Our sin is very real. But so is our Savior. So, for the next 40 days or so, I would challenge you to focus on him in a new way. Spend more time in prayer, deny yourself of a thing that gives you comfort. Read Scripture, spend time in stillness reflecting. Find a new and refreshing way to walk the path that Jesus would have you walk. And remind yourself of this: though the path may seem gloomy, it's about to light up! The tomb will be empty, and Jesus will be very much alive. It's Friday, but Sunday's coming.

# Words About Worship From the Director of Music Ministries



Here is a bit of trivia that might come in handy someday. Easter is the first Sunday after the first full moon after the Spring Equinox. This year, Easter is April 9. The season of Lent consists of the 40 days, excluding Sundays, that precede Easter Sunday. Lent 2023 began Ash Wednesday, February 22.

Lent in the early church was used as a time to prepare new converts to be baptized on Easter Sunday. Today, Lent is a time of repentance, reflection and penitence. For centuries, it has been the custom for liturgical Christians to show penitence by giving up something important to them during Lent. It is also permissible to "take on" something such as additional devotions, Bible study, meditation, etc., instead. The important thing is to use the time to develop a more intimate relationship with God. Some examples of things given up in the past are ice cream, sugar, red meat, negative comments, FaceBook, Coke, Dr. Pepper. Things to take on are extra Bible reading, expanded prayer time, more faithful worship attendance, helping a friend or neighbor who is experiencing difficulty, volunteering for a charity (or your church ), joining a Bible study, healthy eating, physical activity...the lists are endless and limited only by your creativity.

Johnathon's sermons will continue to follow the Gospel reading from the Lectionary during Lent. Those readings are:

March 26 John 1:1-45

As part of your Lenten discipline, you could choose to read and study the weekly scriptures ahead of time.
