From the Pastor's Desk



Early in our marriage, Jamie and I had the honor of serving as missionaries in the Yucatan Peninsula in southern Mexico. It was an eye opening two years. During that time, we developed relationships with some of the most amazing and Christ-like people you could imagine. We got to see how the Christian witness manifested itself in a culture unlike our own, and wouldn't you know it? **THERE WERE SOME DIFFERENCES.**

One of the most startling had to be the way that local followers of Jesus worshipped. Of course, just like in the United States, no two individual churches worshipped exactly the same way. But it was common to see hours long sermons (some of you might die!), long amounts of time spent in spontaneous prayer, and, of course the singing of hymns.

Now, when I say we sang some hymns, don't imagine that it looked like a well-practiced choir spinning out near perfect harmonies while we all turned to the right page in our hymnals. Don't even imagine folks on a guitar or keyboard belting out tunes with the worship lyrics projected on a screen for all to see. Instead, imagine what it would be like if everyone in the church was handed a tambourine or maraca regardless of their sense of rhythm, or if every person in the church sang as loudly and passionately as they could regardless of their ability to carry a tune or sing on key.

That's how they worshipped. It was different. It was strange to me. It took a while for me to get used to. It challenged my understanding of what worship was supposed to look like.

But it was beautiful, and Jesus loved it.

On June 8th, we're starting a new program called the Worship Project. It's an experiment for right now, but the ultimate goal will be for St. Matthew to have a monthly worship service that features modern styles of worship. I can almost guarantee that it will be different than what a lot of us are used to. It might even be as jarring for some of us as what I experienced in Mexico.

You might be saying "but aren't Gayle and the choir doing a good job?" Nope, they're not doing a "good job." They're doing a **GREAT** job! But we're offering a different style of worship because we know different people connect to the Lord in different ways.

A mature Christian is able to worship regardless of the musical style, in any place or environment, because they know that worship **IS NOT ABOUT THEM**. But a lot of folks who are seeking to connect with Jesus for the first time aren't attracted to hymns from a few hundred years ago and don't understand the nuances of our church traditions when they walk in off the street.

So we're going to try something new. It might not work. We might fall flat on our faces.

But we will try our very hardest to worship God with all that we have.

And it might be beautiful, and I bet Jesus will love it.

Please join us on June 8th, and invite anyone you might know who you think might benefit from connecting with Jesus through this style of worship. Thanks!

On July 2nd, Jonathon will have been our pastor for one year. During this year, he has chosen to base his sermons on the Gospel readings in the lectionary. During this second year, he will mix things up and choose other lectionary readings from the Psalms, the Old Testament, and the Pauline Letters, primarily the Book of Romans to begin.

Scripture Readings for June are June 2: Matthew 28:16-20 “The Great Commission,” June 9: Matthew 9:9-18, 18-26, June 16: Matthew 10:16-23, and June 25: Romans 6:1b-11.

July 2nd will be our annual Patriotic Sunday. The Scripture reading is Psalm 13.

At times you might think that it doesn’t make any difference whether you attend worship or not. You would be wrong. If occasionally things aren’t going well or you are just down in the dumps, you need worship to feed your soul. On the other hand, if everything is going great, you are full of the spirit and feel on top of the world, others need you in worship to help lift their spirits. 
