## Words About Worship From the Director of Music Ministries



Happy April!! Sunday felt like winter was over. Today, Tuesday, winter has returned. I was raised in Oklahoma. I know we will have alternating summer and winter until at least May, but I always hope it isn't so.

Before I turn the worship page to April, I must take a moment and say a HUGE THANK YOU! to everyone who had a part in making our Holy Week and Easter worship services so meaningful! Special worship services don't just happen. They take hours of planning and preparation, and many willing volunteers to make it happen. Again, thank you!

Our focus for months has been getting ready for Easter. One of my sayings in choir recently has been, "There is life after Easter Sunday." On that note, here are the Scripture readings and themes for April:

April 7—John 20:19-31, the story of Doubting Thomas.

April 14 — I John 3:1-7, how great God's love for us!

April 21 — Diandra is preaching. The Spirit Singer women will sing "Joyful, Joyful" from Sister Act. Robin Murphy is soloist.

April 28 — John 15:1-8, the vine and the branches.

Our tradition for years has been to sing "Christ the Lord Is Risen Today!" to begin our Easter services. This beautiful hymn was written by John Wesley's brother, Charles. When I researched the hymn, I discovered that Charles not only wrote hymns, but he was also a preacher. The following story is from *Then Sings My Soul* by Robert Morgan.

"John and Charles Wesley found themselves out of favor with many fellow Anglican ministers who spurned their fiery evangelistic preaching. Many pulpits were closed to them." Charles' friend from Oxford, George Whitefield was having the same problem. He started preaching outside and ended up preaching to thousands. He invited Charles to join him.

"He made his first attempt in the outskirts of London...to about 500. He returned to the house rejoicing. Soon he was preaching to thousands. 'My load was gone, and all my doubts and scruples. God shone upon my path; and I knew this was His will concerning me.'

A man named Joseph Williams heard Charles preaching and said, "I think I never heard any man labor so earnestly to convince his hearers they were all by nature in a sinful, lost, undone, damnable state; that notwithstanding, there was a possibility of their salvation, through faith in Christ.'

"Charles Wesley still preaches today in much the same way through his ageless hymns which are sung around the world each Sunday. Perhaps his most exuberant anthem is the one he simply called 'Hymn for Easter Day' published in 1739. It originally consisted of *eleven stanzas*. (italics added) The 'Alleluias' were added later, but appropriately, for this is a hymn one never gets tired of singing:

Christ the Lord is risen today, Alleluia!
Sons of men and angels say, Alleluia!
Raise your joys and triumphs high, Alleluia!
Sing, ye heavens, and earth, reply, Alleluia!"1

I hope to see you in worship Sunday as we continue to celebrate Easter!
