From the Pastor's Desk



Reflecting on the 2024 Oklahoma Annual Conference

Brothers and Sisters of St. Matthew UMC-

I hope this message finds you well and blessed. I am excited to share some highlights from the recent 2024 Oklahoma Annual Conference of the United Methodist Church.

This year's conference was particularly enriching, with a renewed focus on the mission of the church highlighted by numerous reports showcasing the work being done by United Methodists across Oklahoma. From local mission initiatives to global outreach programs, it was truly inspiring to see how our collective efforts are making a positive impact for the Kingdom in communities near and far.

One of the key outcomes of the conference was the successful passage of the annual budget. This budget will fund various ministries, missions, and administrative functions essential to our shared work. We are grateful for the careful planning and stewardship that went into crafting a budget that supports our vision and goals for the coming year. One of the key takeaways for us regarding the budget is that our apportionments continue to be lower than they have been in recent years. This means that, while we continue to participate in shared missions and ministries with our fellow United Methodists in Oklahoma, each of our individual churches are carrying a lighter fiduciary burden than we have in the past.

Another topic of significant interest and concern for many after the General Conference of the UMC in Charlotte, NC last month was the discussion surrounding LGBTQ issues within our church. I want to inform you that at our Oklahoma Annual Conference no new legislation was passed regarding LGBTQ matters. This means that, for the time being, each local church will continue to determine its own policies regarding weddings and other related issues.

For our congregation, this decision allows us to continue discerning our path forward with respect to our beliefs, values, and community needs. It provides us the opportunity to engage in thoughtful and prayerful conversations as we seek to embody Christ's love, holiness, and grace in all that we do. Our trustees have already been prayerfully reviewing our facility use policies regarding weddings, and other committees and leadership teams will be invited for holy conferencing as needed as we continue to discern. But in a very real sense, our community is still the same community that it's always been and is continuing to do the work of Jesus in Midwest City.

From the very beginning, one thing that I've advocated for is for us to make sure that we're making the main thing the main thing. The main thing for all of us should be making disciples of Jesus Christ. As we move forward, let us remain committed to our mission and vision, trusting in God's guidance and wisdom. I encourage all of us to continue supporting one another, fostering open and respectful dialogue with your brother or sister who might have a differing point of view, and staying grounded in our faith. Together, we can navigate the challenges and opportunities that lie ahead with grace and compassion.

Thank you for your continued dedication and faithfulness. Let us keep our hearts and minds focused on the work God has called us to do, both within our congregation and beyond.

May God's blessings be upon you as we journey together in faith.


