# From the Pastor's Desk



I'm looking forward to my first real opportunities to fail at St. Matthew. What a weird thing to say, right? What could I possibly mean by that? Well, I'm glad you asked!

You see, for the last few months I've been in a bit of a honeymoon phase as your pastor. I've come in, done my best not to be too disruptive or to change too many things, and just tried to do ministry the best I can. And for the most part you've given me the benefit of the doubt, given me space to learn the job and grow, and been okay with most of what we've been doing.

In effect, we've all been okay with the status quo while Pastor Jonathon gets his feet wet.

But now we're starting a new year, and that means I have to be honest with you as your pastor and tell you that there are some areas where we as a congregation are lacking.

Let me be really clear: St. Matthew isn't broken. It's not some sort of mechanism that needs fixing. My job isn't to "fix" the church, it's to ensure that we as a community of Jesus followers are making and growing disciples.

We're really good at PARTS of that. But we're called to be whole disciples, not partial disciples. What I mean by that is that some of us are good at worshiping God, some of us are good at sharing the Gospel, some of us are good at studying God's word, some of us are good at loving our neighbors, some of us are good at showing generosity. But a complete disciple will do all of those things.


And St. Matthew is good at providing opportunities in lots of those areas. I love worshipping with you on Sundays, I love seeing the outpouring of Christian love through our various outreach programs, I love the

times I've gotten to pray with you and I love some of the ways I've seen folks in this congregation provide reliable and loving witness to the goodness of Jesus Christ.

But one area is lacking, at least from a church sponsored standpoint: adult Christian education. Only a very small percentage of folks who worship with us or even volunteer with our outreach ministries are part of a Sunday school class, a small group, or other group discipleship opportunities.

I'd like to change that. So I'm cashing in my chips. I'm using whatever good will I've built up, and I'm encouraging us all to actively study God's word TOGETHER. There are two main ways we're going to try to do this in the coming months.

The first is by launching new discipleship classes on Sunday mornings starting January 8<sup>th</sup> during the new Sunday School hour. If you haven't had the chance yet, please check those out. My friend and mentor Rev. Ben Williams will be teaching a class on his book "This Moment With God" and our very own Anita Poole-Endlsey will be teaching a class on Louie Giglio's "Don't Give the Enemy A Seat At Your Table." In addition, our children and youth- who have already been meeting on Sundays for group discipleship- will be beginning new classes. It's a great jumping on point FOR ALL OF US.

The second opportunity will be our new Midweek program starting in February. On Wednesdays, we'll offer a community meal starting at 5:30 and have classes starting at 6:30. The youth, children, and adults will all have offerings, with the adult offering generally being taught by me.

To kick this even off, we'll be hosting Christian illusionists David and Kylie Knight for our Midweek Launch event on February 8<sup>th</sup>. Our hope is that by offering this event we'll be able to draw members of the community into relationship and even discipleship with us and build momentum going forward for the year to come.

Listen, I know it sounds weird on paper. Christian magicians? Really? That's going to draw people in?

It's a huge opportunity to fail. It could be that nobody shows up and the community laughs off our attempt to reach out to them. It could be that nobody comes to our free dinners, or that those who do don't stick around to learn about Jesus.

But I firmly believe that whether we experience success or failure, this is what God is calling us to do. To at least try to make and grow disciples. To take risk.

Will you take the risk with me? Will you come and grow in your faith by growing in your knowledge of Jesus? Will you invite those who most need Jesus to come and experience the things that are happening at St. Matthew?

It's an opportunity for you to fail too, I guess. But it's also an opportunity to do something big for the Kingdom. Will you step out in faith with me?


