From the Pastor's Desk

Greetings, St. Matthew United Methodist family!

In the spirit of the season, let's embark on a journey of anticipation, hope, and expectation—unwrapping the unexpected joys of Advent. During one of my Advent sermons last year I asked you to picture Ralphie from "A Christmas Story," eyes sparkling with excitement over his coveted Little Orphan Annie Secret Society decoder ring, and the disillusionment he experienced when he realized that it was just another marketing scam. It was a relatable moment. We've all had times where we've built up hope, only to face disappointment.

Life, like Ralphie's decoder pin, has a knack for challenging our expectations. Money can't buy happiness, beauty fades, and let's not even start on the letdowns of online shopping!

Advent is a season in the church that is all about expectation. But unlike Ralphie's ring, Advent isn't a season of false promises, but of promises fulfilled. The word "advent" is derived from the Latin "adventus," meaning coming. Ancient Christians actually borrowed the term from the Roman Empire, where cities buzzed with anticipation, celebrating the arrival of Caesar with an "adventus." It wasn't just about the emperor's physical presence; it was a public proclamation of honor and power. They'd even put up decorations!

If an ancient Roman were to time travel to today, there's a good chance they'd recognize what we're doing during Advent, with our own civic and private decorations reminding them of the decorated city streets of ancient Rome, heralding the anticipation of something significant.

What they wouldn't know is how much more significant our own Advent is compared to theirs. Advent is a reminder of why Jesus was born and why we exist. It's a season of hope and anticipation. And it's about more than just anticipating a holiday. It's about the anticipation of Christ's presence. His past presence, his future presence, and his presence at this very moment. In other words "Christ has come, Christ is with us, and Christ will come again."

So, what can we glean about these comings of Christ? Yes, there's the historical Christmas arrival, complete with the 8lb 7 oz. baby Jesus. But let's not forget the second coming—the less-discussed yet crucial aspect of Methodist doctrine. Are we ready for Jesus' return?

If we say that we are, then we have to recognize that this isn't just about the future. In the midst of our anticipation, let's recognize Christ's presence in our lives now. Living for Him, grounded in the present, and making this place ready for His return. Imagine if we lived every day as if Jesus were among us—challenging, guiding, and inspiring us to action.

As we navigate the Advent season, let's unwrap the unexpected joy of anticipation, with our hope firmly anchored in the enduring promises of Christ.

St. Matthew, we have a lot to look forward to in this month with Christmas on the horizon, a ton of special services and events and parties and gifts and time with people we love. But don't forget that at this very moment, Christ is with you, and we are called to live our lives in joyful anticipation of what Christ is going to do next.

Last Sunday we celebrated Christ the King Sunday, the final Sunday in the Christian year. This Sunday, we begin the season of Advent. Can you believe that it's only 4 weeks until Christmas?! Many thanks to the faithful helpers who decorated our church home for the season! There is a sense of expectation in the air. Company is coming! Our "house" is prepared, now we need to prepare our hearts for the coming of the Messiah. Please plan to worship with us in person if you are able. If not, online worship continues on Facebook Live and on Youtube.

A guick refresher course — Advent is a form of the Latin word that means "arrival or to come." The colors of Advent are purple and blue. These colors denote royalty because in ancient times the dyes to make these colors were very rare and prohibitively expensive. Only the very rich could afford them. As we begin worship each Sunday, we will light the Advent candles. There is one candle for each of the four Sundays, Hope, Peace, Joy and Love. The Chrismon tree is decorated with gold balls and our Chrismons. The word Chrismon is a combination of Christ and monograms. They have symbols, or monograms of the Christian faith, cross stitched on them. The lights on the trees and Communion rail remind us that Jesus is the light of the world.

There are many opportunities for worship during Advent. December 3, we will celebrate Holy Communion in both services. We will light the candle of Hope. Scripture reading is Isaiah 64:1-9. Jonathon's sermon title is "Awesome Deeds We Will Not Expect." December 10, is the Candle of Peace, scripture reading is 2 Peter 3:8-15a, sermon title is "Slow vs. Patient." December 17 in the 8:30 service, the scripture is I Thessalonians 5:1624, sermon title is 8 Things to Do While We Wait.

December 17 during the 11am service, the Chancel Choir and Spirit Singers will present our Christmas Cantata, Love by Joel Raney. St. Matthew Youth will provide the drama and we will welcome Mary and Joseph and Baby Jesus!

December 24, Christmas Eve, we will have three services. The first service will be one service at 11am. The scripture reading is Luke 1:26-38. Jonathon's sermon is "Name Him Jesus." The Chancel Choir anthem will be "Sleeping Adonai" with soloist, Maddie Ellis.

The 6pm Christmas Eve Service will feature our children's Christmas Program, "Christmas Hang-Ups." Special music will be provided by Chancel Choir, Do You Hear What I Hear, soloist Bob Dimski, and Spirit Singers "Listen Children, Hear the Angels Sing!" Jonathon will light the Christ Candle and Chelsea Luxen will end the service with "O Holy Night." This service is designed for children, so it will be informal. This is an excellent time to invite family and friends to join you!

The third Christmas Eve service is the 11pm Christmas Eve Candlelight Communion. This service features Carols and Scripture, "A Cradle in Bethlehem" by the Spirit Singers, "O Holy Night" sung by Stacey Ruston, and Holy Communion. The service ends with lighting our individual candles and singing Silent Night. If you have never attended this service, please make this a new part of your Christmas tradition, and bring someone with you. If you desire, pjs for kiddos are not only allowed, but encouraged.

December 31 we will again have one service at 11 am. The Scripture is Galatians 4:4-7 and Diandra Nelson is preaching. End your 2023 the right way with your church family!

I'll see you Sunday morning as we begin our preparation for the coming of the Messiah!
